 Other random facts.


- 2435 Killick Hill Wear**
 Landowner: Roper Weston
 Occupier: Jonathan Lane
 Killick Hill was pastureland.
 Gill Greenwood had art lesson there - checked for cow pads!
- 2436 Wear**
 Landowner: Edward Pearce
 Occupier: William White and others
 Also called Flowers Wear at one point. Cafe on slope.
 Picnic spot. Cow trough - local lads made clay pots + boats.
- 2437 Prankards**
 Landowner: John Searle and Thomas Foot
 Occupier: Edward Looman and others
 Above Wear. Swings for years. Used to be a path along from swings to an area called Donkey Hollow where wild goats liked to hang out.
- 2438 Pitts Wear**
 Landowner: Roper Weston, William White and William Pearce
 Occupier: Selves
 Area above is entry to Tord - where seat is.
 Now this area is mainly waste stone. Site of waste tip?
 Look from top - land slips, evidence of stone den, nuts.
- 2439 Silver Well Wear**
 Landowner: Roper Weston, William White and
 Occupier: Selves
 In 1841 there is a path marked in 2441
 to shore. It might be Hallelujah Bay
 not Jacobs Well/Silverwell as drawn
- 2440 Round Wear**
 Landowner: (3) Weston, White and Pearce
 Occupier: Selves
 I read somewhere that locals profited by allowing waste tips along West Cliff and their land.
 Did this 'do do this' wonder?
- 2441 Knights Wear**
 Landowner: John Searle and Thomas Foot
 I first thought this was Jacobs Well area. Now I think it is maybe Hallelujah Bay. Thruon moved next boulders by hand, but also used a hand-jack to form the path. Stone Slab
- 2442 Under Green Hole**
 Landowner: (4) Weston, White and Pearce
 Occupier: Selves
 Locally known as Green Ump - Sally and Bigne on back of big rock - painted 30+ years ago!
- 2443, 2444 and 2445: Hines Wear, John Stones Wear and Flews Mutton Cove**
 Landowner: (4) Weston, White and Pearce
 Occupier: Selves
 Locally known as Green Ump - Sally and Bigne on back of big rock - painted 30+ years ago!
